### About the College

### NORMS OF ADMISSION

1. A candidate may be admitted to the first year of three-year B.A. /B.Sc. /B.Com. (Honours/General) courses of studies on passing Higher Secondary/(10+2) Examination in General or Vocational Stream conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/Council. or Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya, or National Open School recognized by the Distant Learning Council subject to fulfillment of the conditions mentioned below:

In case of other Boards/Councils, a candidate shall have to pass in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, of full marks not being less than 100 each. A candidate passing in four subjects shall not be eligible for admission.

Candidates passing Higher Secondary examination from vocational stream conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other equivalent board/council are eligible for admission only in General courses (and not in Honours courses) provided that the candidate must have passed in 5 (five) recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, in the previous qualifying examination.

2. Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 3 (three) consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

3. A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:

(I) A minimum of 45% marks in aggregate and 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

or

(II) 50% marks in aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

(III) 55% marks in aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject or any related subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied.

However, candidate belonging to the Schedule Caste or Schedule Tribe community taking up honours course of study shall enjoy 5% relaxation in marks in (1), (II) & (III) above, as the case may be.

### ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. Admission to B.A/B.Sc./B.Com General and Hons courses will be on the basis of the marks obtained in Higher Secondary or equivalent examination recognized by University of Kalyani and other criteria as stated by the University. Notification of admission is made after publication of Higher Secondary result of West Bengal.

- 2. a) As soon as the applicant is notified (through sms or College website) that admission has been offered to him/her, the full admission fees will have to be paid on the day within stipulated time through Bank, otherwise the offer of admission is liable to be cancelled.
- b) The registration must be done within one month on the date of admission; otherwise, admission will be treated as canceled. 75% class attendance must be required for that period.
- 3. All admission valid for one year and for that reason it must be renewed at the end of every academic year.
- 4. FEES ONCE PAID CANNOT BE REFUNDED. Fees once paid will not be carried over for a further session.
- 5. Physical Document verification will be done only after deposition of requisite Admission Fees. At the time of such verification process, if the statement given by the candidate in the application form is found wrong or found to differ from his/her original documents then the Admission will be treated as cancelled.
- 6. Documents required at the time of Physical Document verification:
  - a) Print-out of the Application form (two copies).

- b) Original Payment-slip/Bank Challan and its photocopy.
- c) Original migration certificate and its photocopy (only for migrating students)
- d) Original mark sheet of H.S. or equivalent examination and admit card, and its photocopies
- e) Original admit card of Madhyamik Examination and its photocopy
- f) One copy stamp size colored photograph
- g) Original SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/Physically Disable (if any) certificate and its photocopy.

Certificate from either D.M./S.D.O only valid for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B candidates.

7. Applicants for 1<sup>st</sup> Year admission are requested to visit our college website every moment for any update regarding admission process.

- ১) বি.এ./ বি.এস.সি. / বি.কম. সাধারন ও সাম্মানিক বিভাগে ভর্তির যোগ্যতা প্রাথীর উচ্চ মাধ্যমিক পরীক্ষা অথবা কলানী বিশ্ববিদ্যালয় অনুমোদিত সমতুল পরীক্ষায় প্রাপ্ত নম্বর অথবা প্রতিষ্ঠান নির্দিষ্ট শত অনুযায়ী নির্ধারিত হবে । পশ্চিমবন্ধ উচ্চ মাধ্যমিক পরীক্ষার ফল প্রকাশের পরেই ভর্তি বিষয়ক বিজ্ঞপ্তি প্রকাশিত হয় ।
- ২) ক) কোনো শিক্ষার্থী ভর্তির জনা বিবেচিত হলে, সেই শিক্ষার্থী নির্দিষ্ট এস. এম. এস. অথবা কলেজ ওয়েবসাইটে দেওয়া তথ্যের মাধ্যমে জানতে পারবে।তারপর তাকে কলেজের প্রদেয় সমস্ত বেতন ও অন্যান্য খাতে প্রদেয় অর্থ ব্যাঙ্কের মাধ্যমে জমা দিতে হবে। ভর্তি বাবদ নির্দিষ্ট পরিমাণে এ অর্থ নির্দিষ্ট সময়ের মধ্যে জমা না দিলে ভর্তি বাতিল বলে গণ্য হবে।

### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Students are admitted in the college strictly on the basis of merit. A merit list is prepared on the basis of marks in best five subjects in the (10+2) Level Examination.
- 2. All students are accountable to the Principal for their conduct in College.

- 3. a) According to the University of Kalyani rules, a candidate shall be considered as Collegiate if he/she attends at least 75% of lectures & practical classes in all subjects, and as Non-Collegiate if attendance in any subject falls short of 75% but not below 60%. Candidates declared Non-Collegiate may be allowed to fill in application forms for Examination on payment of requisite Non-Collegiate fees. A candidate who has not attended at least 60% of lectures shall be considered Discollegiate & shall be debarred from appearing in any examination. In case of absence due to illness, students are required to submit to the Principal, a medical certificate with a letter from the parents (guardian) explaining the reason for absence.
- b) Class attendance of all the students will be informed at interval of every 3 months. The students / guardians should personally collect the information. If necessary he/she may contact the corresponding departments.
- 4. Any change in subject combinations of 1<sup>st</sup> year students must be done within stipulated time as declared by University of Kalyani.
- 5. Students must carry their Identity Card bearing their photographs.
- 6. Any student found guilty of damaging college property or of any other form of indiscipline like writing on/defacing walls will be severely punished.
- 7. Smoking and Spitting are strictly forbidden in the college premises.
- 8. All College excursions or outings require the prior sanction of the Principal.
- 9. Guardians are required to attend Guardians' Meeting scheduled to be held as per Principal's notification for an interface with the Faculties and Administration.

### সাধারণ নিয়মাবলী

- ১) সম্পূর্ণ মেধার ভিত্তিতে এই কলেজে ছাত্র-ছাত্রীদের ভর্তি করা হয়। (১০+২) স্তরে সর্কোচ্চ পাঁচটি বিষয়ে প্রাপ্ত নম্বরের ভিত্তিতে মেধা তালিকা প্রস্তুত করা হয়।
- ২) সমস্ত ছাত্র-ছাত্রী তাদের আচরণের জন্য অধ্যক্ষা মহাশয়ার কাছে দায়ভাগী থাকবে।
- ৩) ক) কল্যানী বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের নিয়ম অনুযায়ী কোনো ছাত্র-ছাত্রী শতকরা ৭৫% (পঁচাত্তর) ক্লাসে উপস্থিত থাকলেই নিয়মিত বা কলেজিয়েট হিসেবে গণ্য হবে । যদি উপস্থিতির হার ৭৫% এর কম কিন্তু ৬০% এর উপরে থাকে তাহলে অনিয়মিত বা 'নন্-কলেজিয়েট' হিসেবে গণ্য হবে । এই সকল অনিয়মিত বা 'নন্-কলেজিয়েট' ছাত্র-ছাত্রীদের বিশ্ববিদ্যালয়ের পরীক্ষারফর্ম ফিলাপ এর জন্য নির্ধারিত 'নন্-কলেজিয়েট' ফি প্রদান করতে হবে। কিন্তু উপস্থিতির হার ৬০% এর কম হলে সে কলেজবহির্ভূত বা 'ডিস-কলেজিয়েট' রূপে গণ্য হবে এবং কোনো পরীক্ষায় বসবার ক্ষেত্রে উপযুক্ত বলে বিবেচিত হবে না । অসুস্থতা জনিত অনুপস্থিতির ক্ষেত্রে ছাত্র-ছাত্রীদের চিকিৎসকের উপযুক্ত শংসাপত্র সহ পিতা বা মাতার (অভিভাবকের) চিঠি সহ অনুপস্থিতির কারণ জানিয়ে আবেদন করতে হবে ।

### UGC DRAFT REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER

#### EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009

In exercise of the power conferred by Clause (g) of Sub-Section (1) of Section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, the University Grants Commission hereby makes the some Regulations called the "UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Education Institutions, 2009". It shall come into force with immediate effect to all the universities established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, a Provincial Act or a State Act, to all institutions deemed to be university under section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, to all other higher educational institutions. Including the departments, constituent units and all the premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen etc.) of such universities / deemed universities and other higher educational institutions, whether located within the campus or see the "College Notice Board".

## Infrastructure & Resources

## The College Building and Seminar Halls:

The College Building is divided into five separate segments, viz. Dwijendralal Roy Bhavan (Arts Building), Sir Acharya Prafulla Chandra Roy Bhavan (Science Building), Amartya Sen Bhavan (Commerce Building), Rabindranath Tagore Bhavan (Administrative Building including Principal's Chamber) and Sonar Tori (Central Library). It includes spacious and well-ventilated class rooms, laboratories, staff room, girls' common room, multi wash rooms, canteen, library reading room, students' union room and a playground surrounded by plants and trees. 'A.P. J. Abdul Kalam Seminar Hall' with the capacity of 200 seats serves the

purposes of academic and cultural activities of the College. Another one is the 'Satyendranath Bose Seminar Hall' with the capacity of 80 seats has been setup with almost all modern provisions. Very recently a 'Virtual Class Room' has been set up with the help of the Govt. of West Bengal.

#### Hostel:

There is a hostel called 'Swami Vivekananda Bhavan' for SC/ST boy's with optimum facilities. The UGC has already granted a sum of 80 lacs for the construction of women's hostel which is under construction.

#### Laboratories:

Departments like Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Geography, Zoology, Botany, Computer Science, Statistics have well-equipped and modernized laboratories. Students are groomed by the expert teachers to have an individual hands-on-experience.

#### Library:

Near about 25350 books (texts and references altogether), news papers, journals and books with updated information are available here. With the recent implementation of INFLIBNET facility through N-List programme, the Central library has become updated and a pool of e-journals/e-books is accessed very easily. Students of both Day and Morning sections are benefited by the Library. The college library remains open to all students from 8.30 am to 5 pm on Monday, Wednesday and Friday; 10.30 am to 5 pm on Tuesday and 8.30 am to 2 pm on Saturday. Books are lent out to the students on the submission of library cards – two for Hons. and one for General course students. Besides it has a reading section also. Books can be borrowed for a period of 15 days. A fine of fifty paisa per day will be charged if books are not submitted within due date. If the library card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued on submission of Rs. 20/- (Reference card) and Rs. 20/- (lending card). Departmental libraries are also operative for the benefit of the students within a limited capacity.

### Three dimensions that work in harmony

The Students: The students of the College are it's pride-academically, culturally and socially. The students' union is always instrumental in keeping up a student-friendly, healthy atmosphere. The campus is completely free from ragging. Down the years the students of this College have been stealing the show in final University examinations. Some of them also leave an impression in other fields like games and sports. A great number of students attain higher education after completing the Under Graduate courses.

Teaching Faculty and Librarians: This is composed of 29 Full-Time teachers (including Principal), 09 PTT, 03 CWTT and a large number of Guest Teachers who try their level best to impart maximum possible educational benefits to the students with their academic proficiency and commitment. Two Full-Time Librarians and one Part Time Librarian are also dedicated to serve the students and staff.

Non-Teaching Faculty and Office: A bunch of efficient and painstaking staff is up for serving the College office and the students year after year. A fully computerized office renders multifarious service to nearly five thousand students on one hand and to the administrations on the other.

Students Benefit and Support System

\* Scholarships, stipends, free-studentship: The College extends free-studentship to quite a considerable number of poor but regular and meritorious students. The quite a considerable number of poor students. Apart from this, students students' union also helps a lot in this disbursement. Apart from this, students belonging to SC, ST, OBC, Minority categories avail stipends as are allocated by the Govt. of West Bengal and India. Female students, on fulfilling the norms decided by the State Govt. are eligible for Kanyasree stipends.

\* Remedial Coaching/Entry-in-services for SC, ST, OBC, Minority students: Funded by the UGC, the College provides remedial coaching and entry-in-services programmes for the SC, ST, OBC and Minority students. The response is quite

\* Tutorial Classes: In addition to the classes as per master time table, the Departments offer weekly tutorial classes to the Hons. students. Holding class tests is almost a

\* Canteen: The College runs a Canteen that caters to the need of students and the staff.

\* Internal Assessment: Though no longer a part of the final University examinations, the College keeps up a steady and disciplined system of evaluating the students through class tests and pre-final test examinations. The answer scripts are shown to the students for rectification and improvement.

\* Computer Centre: The College provides a free of cost computer training to the willing students in its own Computer Centre. In addition to it, a MOU was signed in 1994 between Chakdaha College and NIELIT (formerly DOEACC Society) to run a Computer Centre in assistance with 'The Institute of Computer Engineers (India)' inside the College premises, where the students of our College could complete different job oriented certificate courses at subsidized rate. The students having employment exchange card may avail a scholarship upto Rs. 2000.00.

\* Identity Cards: Identity cards are distributed among the authentic students every year. Wearing those cards inside the college premises is a must.

\* Career Counseling and Placement Cell: It enlightens the students as to their future career - academic or professional. Also the college maintaining the following two job-oriented courses:

1. National Skill and Entrepreneurship Development Programme(NSEDP) (100H) organized by ICWAI and supported by HAL.

2. Certificate course on Taxation Practice & Procedure (100H) organized by ICWAI.

& Educational Tours: Departments of Botany, Zoology and Geography organize educational tours every year as per their prescribed curricula.

\* Grievance Redressal Cell: This cell attains the grievances/complaints, if any, of the students and redresses the same accordingly.

\* Women's Cell & ICC: Women's Cell & ICC emphasize the awareness of the potentials of the female students, their health consciousness and hygienic practice. Very recently a sanitary napkin vending machine for the girl students has been installed in the girls' common room. The Cell also sensitizes them about social justice and empowerment for all women in the Institution and society and also grooms them with positive attitude to life.

\* Academic Calendar: The College strictly adheres to a well-planned academic calendar specifying the schedule of academic activities. All events including the examinations are held strictly according to this calendar. Prospective students are advised to go through the current calendar to get acquainted with the academic events of the College.

- \* Separate Departmental Notice Boards: Other than the centrally fixed Notice boards, there are Departmental notice boards for displaying relevant academic/official information for the perusal of all concerned.
- \* Purified Drinking Water Facility: In different buildings purified drinking water is supplied to the students and the staff through the installation of water purifier.
- \* Access to Internet and Wi-Fi Facilities: The entire College zone has an access to free internet and Wi-Fi facilities as are needed for academic purposes of the students.
- \* Re-union and Alumni Association: Different departments organize annual re-unions under the initiatives of teachers and students together. The College has a registered alumni association named ABAHOMAN to build up an emotional rapport between the ex and existing students. It also helps in building a very friendly atmosphere.
- ❖ Students' Union: Students' Union is one of the vitally functioning bodies that serve various purposes of the students and work also for humanitarian causes. The union arranges for cultural activities like Freshers' welcome, annual sports, annual social, Bhasa Dibas and works conjointly with the College authority in holding blood donation camps, thalassaemia detection camps, eye check-up camps, tree plantations or granting free studentships. The union organizes cultural competitions and publishes College Magazine.
- \* Students' Feedback: Students give the feedback about the teachers at the end of each session in a model questionnaire issued by the NAAC which are then analyzed by the IQAC for further overall improvement of the Institution.
- \* NCC: At present the College has one NCC unit for boys, run under the vigilant supervision of Lt. Dr. Paritosh Biswas. Many cadets have excelled in their performance in State and National levels. Almost every year cadets are selected for the Republic day camp in New Delhi. Enrolment in this unit is completed usually by the month of July. We hope to introduce another NCC unit for girls very soon.
- \* NSS: Like NCC, one unit of NSS is run under the supervision of Prof. Susanta Ghosh. NSS volunteers are selected almost every year for participating in camps on prerepublic day and Republic Day held in New Delhi. They also attend National integration camps, arranged outside the states or sometimes within the periphery of the College. This unit helps in building up a co-operative attitude to serve the society.
- \* Netaji Subhash Open University (NSOU): The College has a study centre under Netaji Subhash Open University (NSOU) since 1998. All eligible candidates may Study UG & PG courses in different subjects according to his or her convenience. Also there are BLIS, MLIS, different diploma & certificate courses in the centre. Also there are admitted in two semesters January & July of each year. All Graduates Students are admitted in two semesters January & July of each year. Bengali, English, from the colleges may study PG courses in the following subjects Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Education, and Mathematics & MSW.
