NORMS OF ADMISSION

A candidate may be admitted to the first semester of three-year (Six Semester) B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Honours & Programme / General) courses of studies on passing Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination in general conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/Council, or The W.B. Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, or The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognized by the Distance Education Bureau (DEB) subject to fulfillment of the conditions mentioned below:

In case of other Boards/Councils, a candidate shall have to pass in five recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, of full marks not being less than 100 each. A candidate passing in four subjects shall not be eligible for admission.

However, candidates passing Higher Secondary examination from vocational stream conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Technical & Vocational Education & Skill Development (WBSCTVE&SD) or any other equivalent board/council are eligible for admission only in Programme/General courses (and not in Honours courses) provided that the candidate must have passed in 5 (five) recognized subjects, of which one shall be English, in the previous qualifying examination.

- Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 3 (three) consecutive academic sessions including the year of passing the previous qualifying examination. For example, candidates passing H.S. Examination in the year 2019 will get last chance of admission in the academic session 2021-2022.
- A candidate taking up Honours Course in a subject must have obtained:
 - A minimum of 45% marks in aggregate and 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

(III) 55% marks in aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject or any related subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied.

However, candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe community taking up honours course of study shall enjoy 5% relaxation in marks in (I), (II) & (III) above, as the case may be.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- Admission to B.A./B.Com. (Programme/General & Honours) courses will be on the basis of the marks obtained in Higher Secondary or equivalent examination recognized by University of Kalyani and other criteria as stated by the University. Notification of admission is made after publication of Higher Secondary result of West Bengal and following the Govt. Order No. 706-Edn (CS)/10M-95/14 dated 13th July, 2021
- a) As soon as the applicant is notified (through SMS or College website) that admission has been offered to him/her, the full admission fees will have to be paid on the day within stipulated time through Bank, otherwise the offer of admission is liable to be cancelled.
 - b) The registration must be done within one month of the date of admission; otherwise, admission will be treated as cancelled. 75% class attendance must be required for that period.
- All admission is valid for one semester (Six Months) only and therefore it must be renewed at the end of every semester.
- 4. Fees once paid will not be carried over for a further session.
- 5. Physical Document verification: As per Govt. Notification No. 706-Edn(CS)/10M-95/14 dated 13th July, 2021, verification of documents, if required, should be done only when the students report for the classes in due course. Admission will be cancelled if the documents are found not in conformity with the declaration in the forms submitted online.
- 6. Documents required at the time of verification (if necessary) are:
 - a) Print-out of the Application form (One copy).
 - b) Original Payment-slip/Bank Challan and its photocopy.
 - c) Original migration certificate and its photocopy (only for migrating students)
 - d) Original marksheet of H.S. or equivalent examination and its photocopy
 - e) Original admit card of Madhyamik Examination and its photocopy
 - f) One copy stamp size colored photograph
 - g) Original SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/Physically Challenged/Sports Certificate (if any) and its photocopy. Certificate from either D.M./S.D.O. only valid for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B candidates.
 - h) Original School leaving certificate.
- 7. Applicants for 1st Semester admission are requested to visit our College website every moment for any update regarding admission process.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Students are admitted to the College strictly on the basis of merit. A merit list is prepared on the basis of marks obtained in the best five subjects in the (10+2) Level Examination. The admission process starts as per the notification of the University of Kalyani and WBHED after the declaration of Class XII results of major National Boards and West Bengal Board.
- 2. All students are accountable to the Principal for their conduct in College.
- 3. a) A student is required to attend all classes. Attendance in Theory and Practical/Tutorial classes shall be counted separately as per UGC guidelines. A candidate shall be allowed to appear at any of the semester-end-examinations if he/she has attended 75% or above in Lectures/Practical/Tutorial classes of the programme held during that semester. If the attendance falls below 75%, then he/she shall not be allowed to appear in the semester-end-examinations. "Candidates having the attendance below 75% except on justified medical ground but above 50% may be considered for appearing in the end term examination subject to the approval of the appeal of the student concerned with medical certificate or any other relevant documents by the University authority". In case of absence due to illness, students are required to submit to the Principal, a medical certificate with a letter from the parents (guardian) explaining the reason for absence.
 - b) Class attendance of all the students will be informed at the interval of every 2 months. The students / guardians should personally collect the information. If necessary he/she may contact the corresponding departments.
- 4. Any change in subject combinations of 1st semester students must be done within stipulated time as declared by University of Kalyani.
- Students must carry their Identity Card bearing their photographs. Exchange or lending of one's identity card is a serious offence.
- 6. Any student, found guilty of damaging College property or of any other form of indiscipline like writing on/defacing walls will be severely punished.
- 7. Smoking and Spitting are strictly forbidden in the College premises. The entire College is "No Smoking Zone".

- 8. Any kind of violent conduct in the College is strictly prohibited.
- 9. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the College.
- 10. Damage should not be caused to any College property in any form. College Computer System should not be tampered in any way.
- 11. Use of Cell Phone during class hours (off line mode) is punishable
- 12. Use of drugs/alcohol is strictly prohibited in the College.
- 13. Bringing guests in the College is strictly prohibited.
- 14. Access to the Girls' Common Room is strictly reserved for female students.
- 15. During College class hours, no outdoor games even in small groups, are to be played anywhere in the College premises.
- 16. No poster is to be posted or fixed with cello tape anywhere on the College walls, For any writing on the walls, strict punishment will be imposed.
- 17. Students should follow the Notice Board & College website/College facebook page daily.
- 18. Students should follow decency in dressing and decorum in conduct.
- 19. Students should maintain punctuality in all matters, especially in Class Attendance and Examination Attendance.
- 20. All College excursions or outings require the prior sanction of the Principal.
- 21. Guardians are required to attend Guardians' Meeting as and when scheduled to be held as per Principal's notification for an interface with the Faculties and Administration.
- 22. Students should strictly adhere to all the Covid-19 protocols/norms, issued by the Govt. time to time.

INFRASTRUCTURE & RESOURCES

THE COLLEGE BUILDING AND SEMINAR HALLS :-

The College Building is divided into five separate segments, viz. Dwijendra Lal Roy Bhawan (Arts Building), Acharya Prafulla Chandra Roy Bhawan (Science Building), Amartya Sen Bhawan (Commerce Building), Rabindra Nath Tagore Bhawan (Administrative Building including Principal's Chamber) and Sonar Tari (Central Library). It includes spacious and well-ventilated class rooms, laboratories, staff room, girls' common room, multi wash rooms, canteen, library reading room, students' union room and a playground surrounded by lush green vegetation. An auditorium cum seminar hall named A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Sabhakakshya with capacity of 200 seats serves the purposes of academic and cultural activities of the College. There is another seminar hall, Vidyasagar Sabhakakshya, with the capacity of 80 seats has been setup with almost all modern provisions.

HOSTEL

There is a hostel for SC/ST boys with optimum facilities for 14 numbers of students. The official procedure for consruction of a new Hostel for girls has been started with the help of RUSA 2.0 fund.

LABORATORIES

Departments like Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Geography, Zoology, Botany, Computer Science and Statistics have already well-equipped and modernized laboratories, which are also updated as per the new CBCS syllabus with RUSA 2.0 grant. Students are groomed by the expert teachers to have an individual hands-on-experience.

LIBRARY

Near about 28,972 books (texts and references altogether), newspapers, journals and periodicals with updated information are available in the Central Library. Very recently, with the assistance of RUSA 2.0 fund of Rs. 12 lac (approx.), a huge number of books for all the Departments have been purchased as per the requirement of new CBCS syllabus. With the recent implementation of INFLIBNET facility through N-List programme, the Central library has become updated and a pool of e-journals/e-books is accessed very easily. Students of both Day and Morning sections are benefited by the Library. The College library remains open to all students from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm on Monday, Wednesday and Friday; 10:30 am to 5:00 pm on Tuesday and 8:30 am to



2:00 pm on Saturday. Books are lent out to the students on the submission of library cards - two for Hons. and one for General course students. Besides, it has a reading section also. Books can be borrowed for a period of 15 days. A fine of fifty paisa per day will be charged if books are not submitted within due date. If the library card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued on submission of Rs. 20/- (for Reference card) and Rs. 20/- (for Lending card). Departmental libraries are also operative for the benefit of the students within a limited capacity.

SOLAR POWER PROJECT

Renewable energy must play a major role in the energy mix for achieving sustainable energy security in the years ahead. A rooftop solar PV system of capacity 10kWp has been installed on Net-metering basis on 5.07.2021 at our Chakdaha College campus on the rooftop of Science Building with the full financial support from Govt. of West Bengal and in assistance with the West Bengal Pollution Control Board. The power generated from SPV panels during the day time can be utilized for powering captive loads and for feeding excess power if any to the grid. RTS plant ensures fruitful utilization and economic value of idle rooftops also.





STUDENTS' BENEFIT AND SUPPORT SYSTEM

- Scholarships, stipends, free-studentship: The College extends free-studentship to quite a considerable number of poor but regular and meritorious students. The students' union also helps a lot in this disbursement. Apart from this, students belonging to SC, ST, OBC, Minority categories avail stipends as are allocated by the Govt. of West Bengal and India. Female students, on fulfilling the norms decided by the State Govt. are eligible for Kanyasree stipends.
- WBSCC: In 2021, the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal has launched the a new project called 'Student Credit Card Scheme' to support the students to pursue their undergraduate and other different levels of studies without feeling any financial constraints. The students can avail the facility of borrowing a certain amount of loan for continuing their studies in different courses under this scheme in Chakdaha College also. - Endowment Fund: Medals, prizes are endowed by the College to the toppers in both Hons. and General courses examinations held by the University of Kalyani and also to the successful students in the fields of Games and Sports in State/National level.
- Tutorial Classes for Doubt clearing: In addition to the classes as per master time table, each Department offers regular Tutorial classes especially to the Hons. students. Besides, the students from both General and Hons. courses can easily approach any teacher for clearing their doubts. Students get benefitted through regular class tests in these classes.
- Canteen: The College runs a Canteen that caters to the need of students.
- Computer Centre: Our College provides a free of cost computer training to the willing students in its own Computer Centre. In addition to it, a MOU was signed in 1994 between Chakdaha College and NIELIT (formerly DOEACC Society) to run a Computer Centre in assistance with The Institute of Computer Engineers (India) inside the College premises, where the students of our College could complete different job oriented certificate courses at subsidized rate. The students having employment exchange card may avail a scholarship upto Rs. 2000.00.
- Identity Cards: Identity cards are distributed among the bonafide students every year.
 Wearing those cards inside the college premises is must.
- Career Counseling and Placement Cell: It enlightens the students regarding their future career – academic or professional. It has been constituted with the following objectives:
 - To act as an interface between the corporate world and the students in order to bridge the gap between them.
 - To act as a contact point for the companies who wish to recruit students from Chakdaha College.
 - To assist students in becoming ready for the corporate world by organizing workshops and Career fairs for the students of the College.
- Educational Tours: Departments of Botany, Zoology and Geography organize educational tours every year as per their prescribed curricula with prior approval from the Principal.
- Grievance Redressal Cell: This cell pays heed to the grievances/complaints, if any, of the students and redresses the same accordingly.












The ratio of weightage between the semester-end-examination and internal assessment shall be 80:20.

Class Attendance cum Internal Assessment:
